Pass #1: Max of 10 units, ~2 classes

Pass #3: Max of 21 units, ~5 classes

- Often difficult to get the last class in Pass 3
- if don't get into the right class:
 - add an extra class to the schedule
 - get on the waitlist of preferred class
 - can crash the preferred class on day 1 of instruction

Pass #2: Max of 15 units, ~3 classes

Tips for Registering for Classes



- Add all of the courses you'd like to sign up for into your Registration Cart so that you can sign up for them quickly during your Pass Time
- Sign up for classes that you need most/classes that fill up most quickly during Pass 1
 - For ENVST B.S. students, Chemistry and Chem Labs will fill up fast, so great to get this on Pass 1
 - Alternatively, in your second year, B.S. students need to take Biology, but the course is an 800 person lecture, so a lot of students save signing up for it until Pass 2 or 3
- Many departments restrict their classes to majors only on Pass 1. If you need a class in another department with restrictions, the earliest you can sign up for it is Pass 2.
- When in doubt, can add a GE!

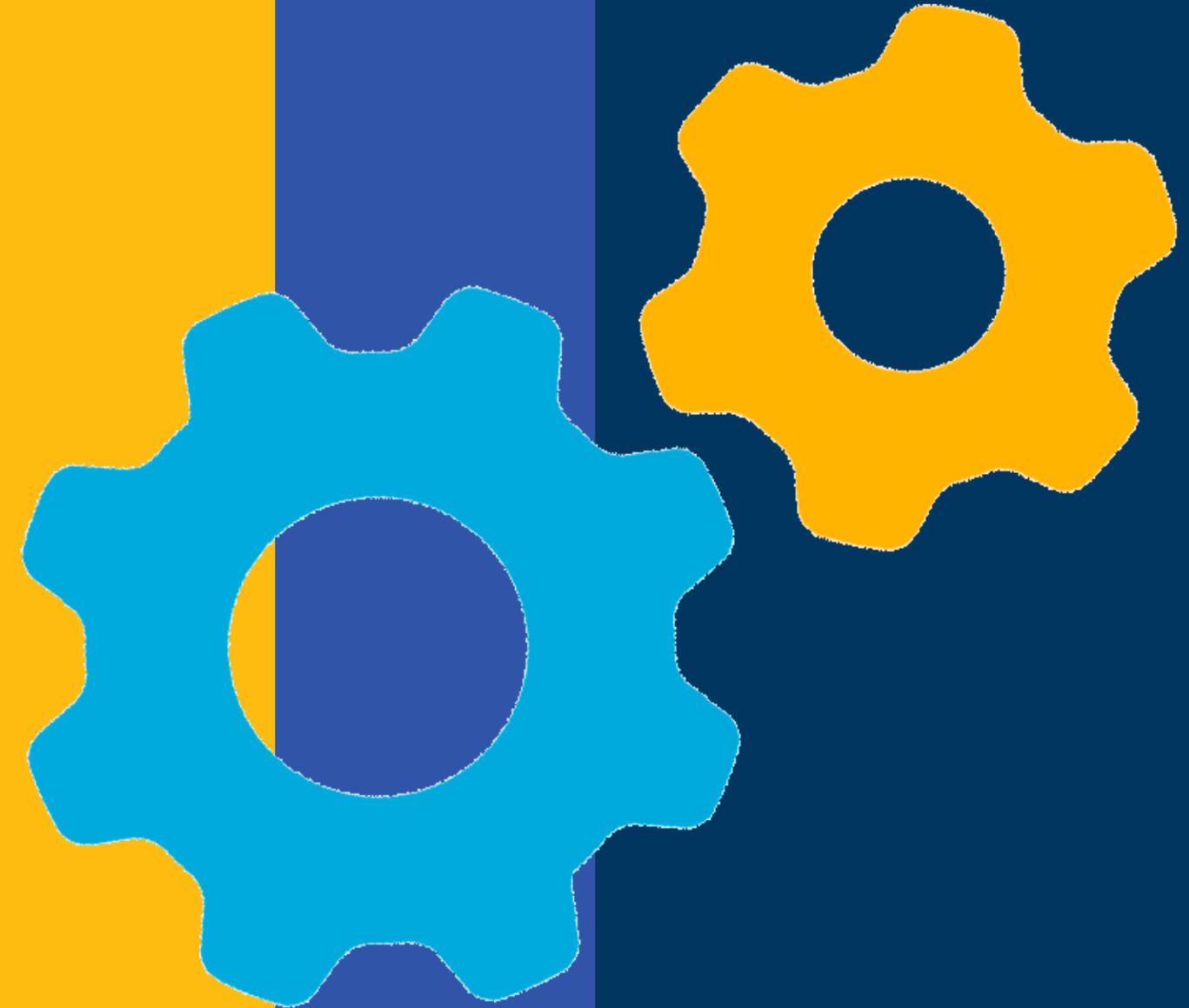
Use the Link/Course Waitlist Feature

- Waitlists are only available to students once they are enrolled in 12 units (Pass 2)
- When opt into the waitlist, get on the waitlist for all sections (even ones that conflict in your schedule)
 - It's much easier to switch sections, once officially in a class than trying to get into a class
- Students have the option to link a course they are currently enrolled in with a course they have waitlisted
 - When you get off the waitlist, you will be dropped from the course you are currently enrolled in and added to your waitlisted course in its place
- Linked course don't count towards the unit max per pass time!

How to Run Your Own Progress Check

Did you know you can run your own degree audit? The Progress Check feature on GOLD brings up the exact same progress check that advisors use when we meet with students! Checking your progress regularly can help you stay on track with your degree.

Once a petition has been approved, it may take up to two weeks to be reflected on your Major Progress Check.

Use in-progress courses on my major progress check. By checking this box I acknowledge my understanding that a 'work-in-progress' major progress check includes courses that have not yet received final grades. I understand that requirements satisfied with in-progress courses may later be found to be unmet if the courses are not taken and completed, or if the necessary grades are not earned. I also understand that for the purposes of this major progress check, in-progress courses (including grades of 'I,' blank grades, etc.) will be included in the GPA calculations as if they were assigned grades.

What-If Major Progress Check: If you are running a major progress check for a major that is not your current major, you may be able to use this feature to determine if you meet the requirements (e.g., minimum completed units, minimum GPA, etc.) for that major. This feature is only available for majors that have a "What-If" option. When a student is able to change into that major. These requirements may vary from the requirements for that major. It is highly recommended that you consult with your advisor before using this feature. This feature does not transfer to any other major progress check. To officially change your declared major, you must file a petition with your department. Consider the impact of this change to your schedule or academic plan. To officially change your declared major, you must file a petition with your department.

Double Major: If you are currently enrolled in a double major or considering a double major, the restriction that no more than 8.0 units may be applied simultaneously to the upper-division units is not accounted for; therefore this major progress check may not accurately reflect your degree requirements. It may not correctly reflect the units required separately for each major to meet major academic residency. Previously filed petitions for your declared major will not transfer to this progress check. Consult with your major department advisors if you are a double major or are planning to pursue a double major.

Clicking this button means that the progress check will include classes that you are currently enrolled in, and not just ones you have completed

If it does not auto-populate "Environmental Studies," you can pick it from the drop-down feature. You can select either B.A. or B.S. from the second drop down feature

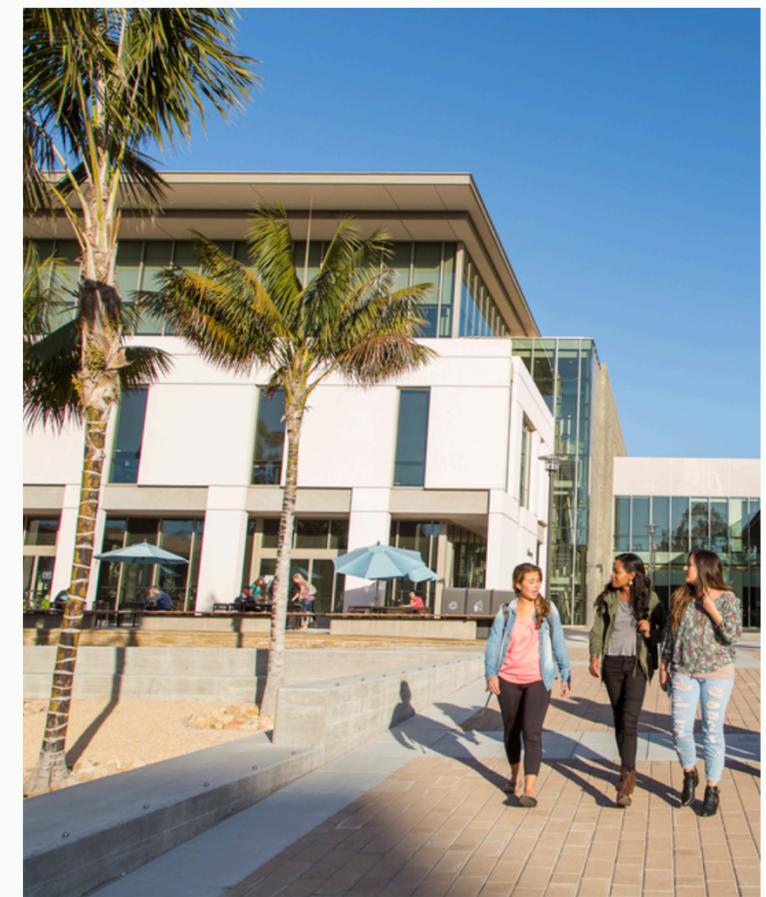
